



In a few sentences, explain the pollination process. Pollination is the transfer of pollen in a flower. This can happen by an pollinating animal such as a butterfly or bee carrying pollen from the flower's anther to the stigma, moving it from the male parts of a flower to the female parts. Pollination can also occur through wind transfer. Pollen grains on the stigma join with or fertilize the ovule to produce new seed. The ovary becomes the fruit. A fruit is the sweet and fleshy part of a tree or plant that contains seeds and can be eaten as food.
