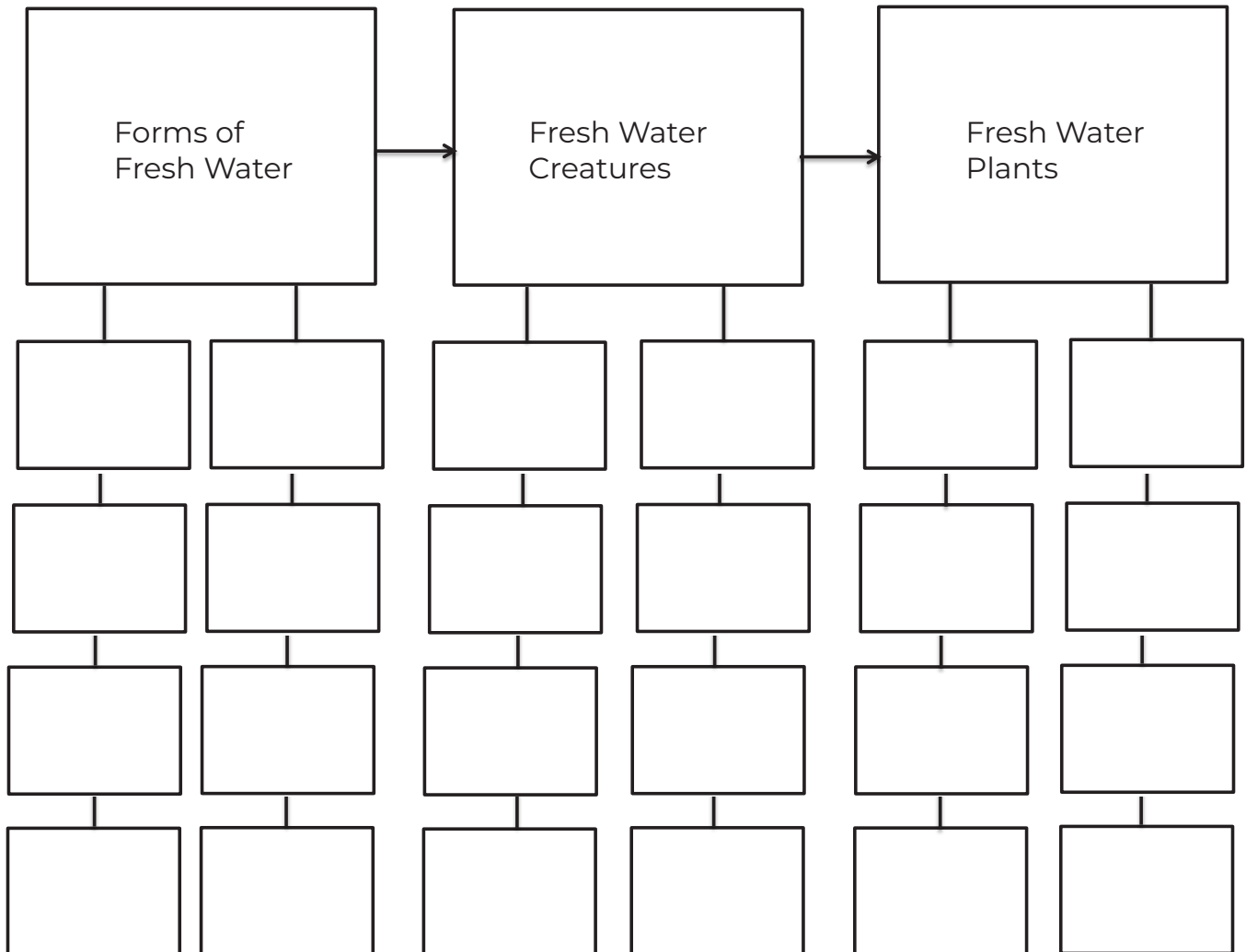

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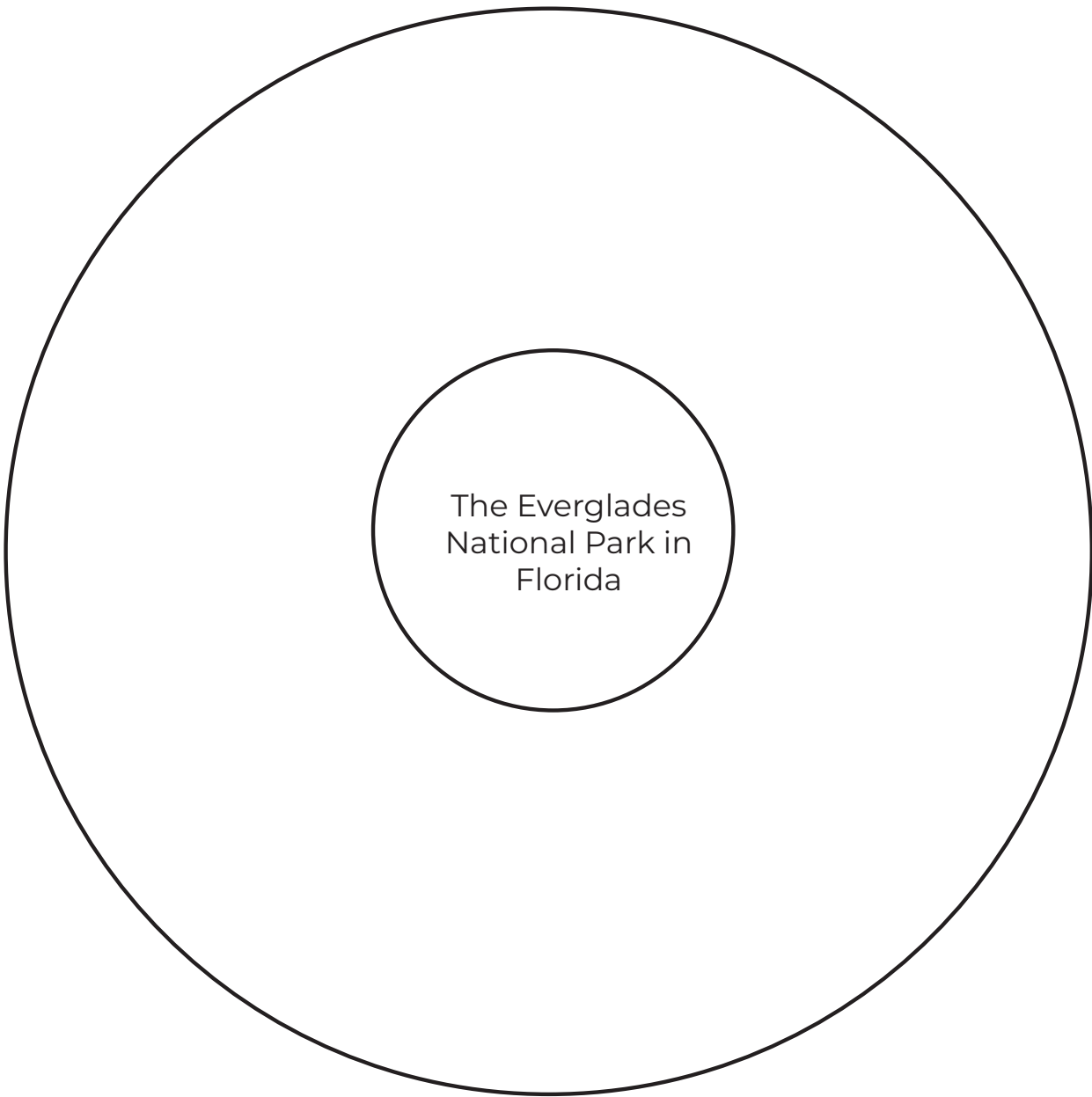

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Students: After reading "Around the World," fill in the circle map below with phrases, terms and facts about Everglades National Park in Florida. You do not have to write in complete sentences.

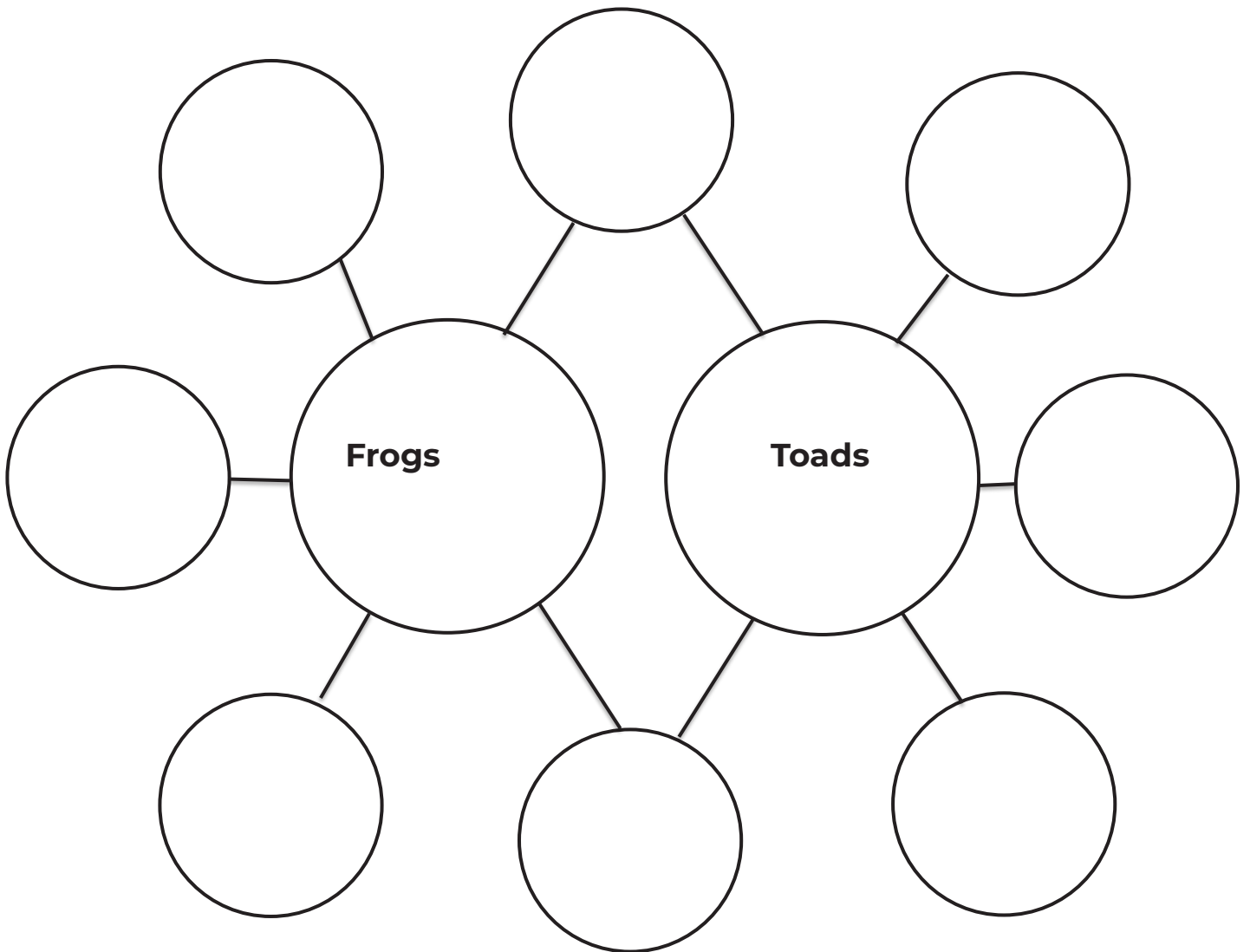

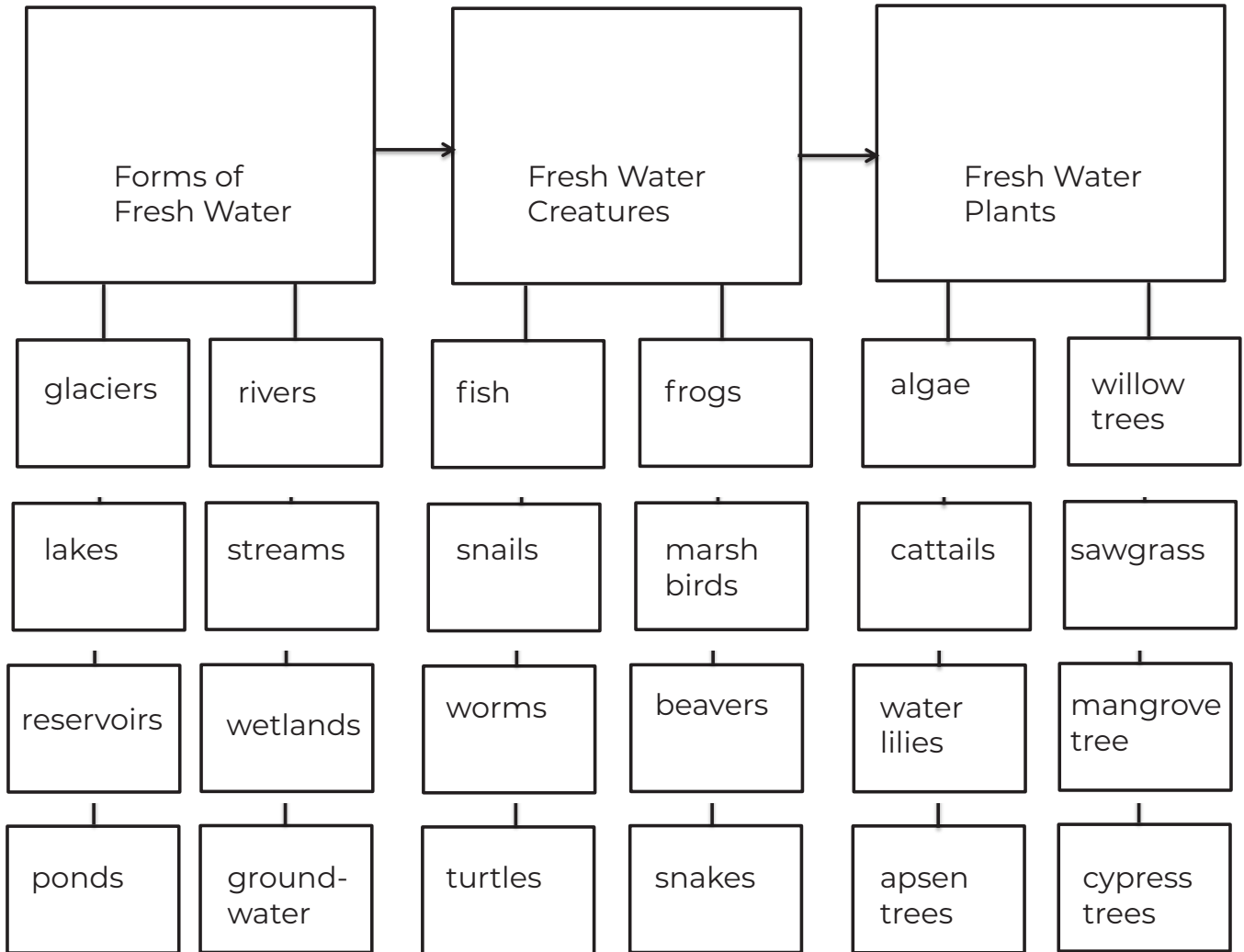

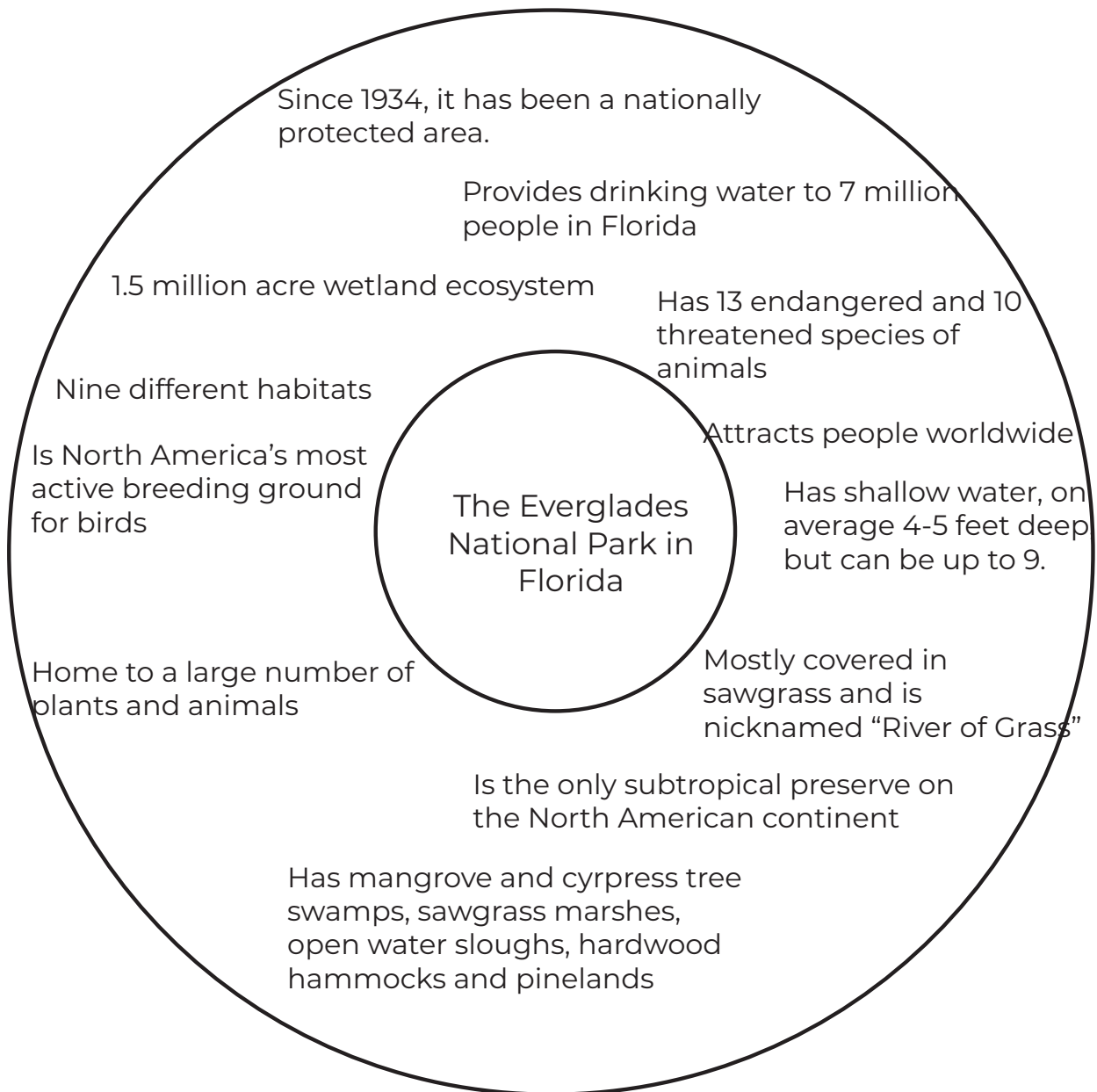


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
