1. The queen bee

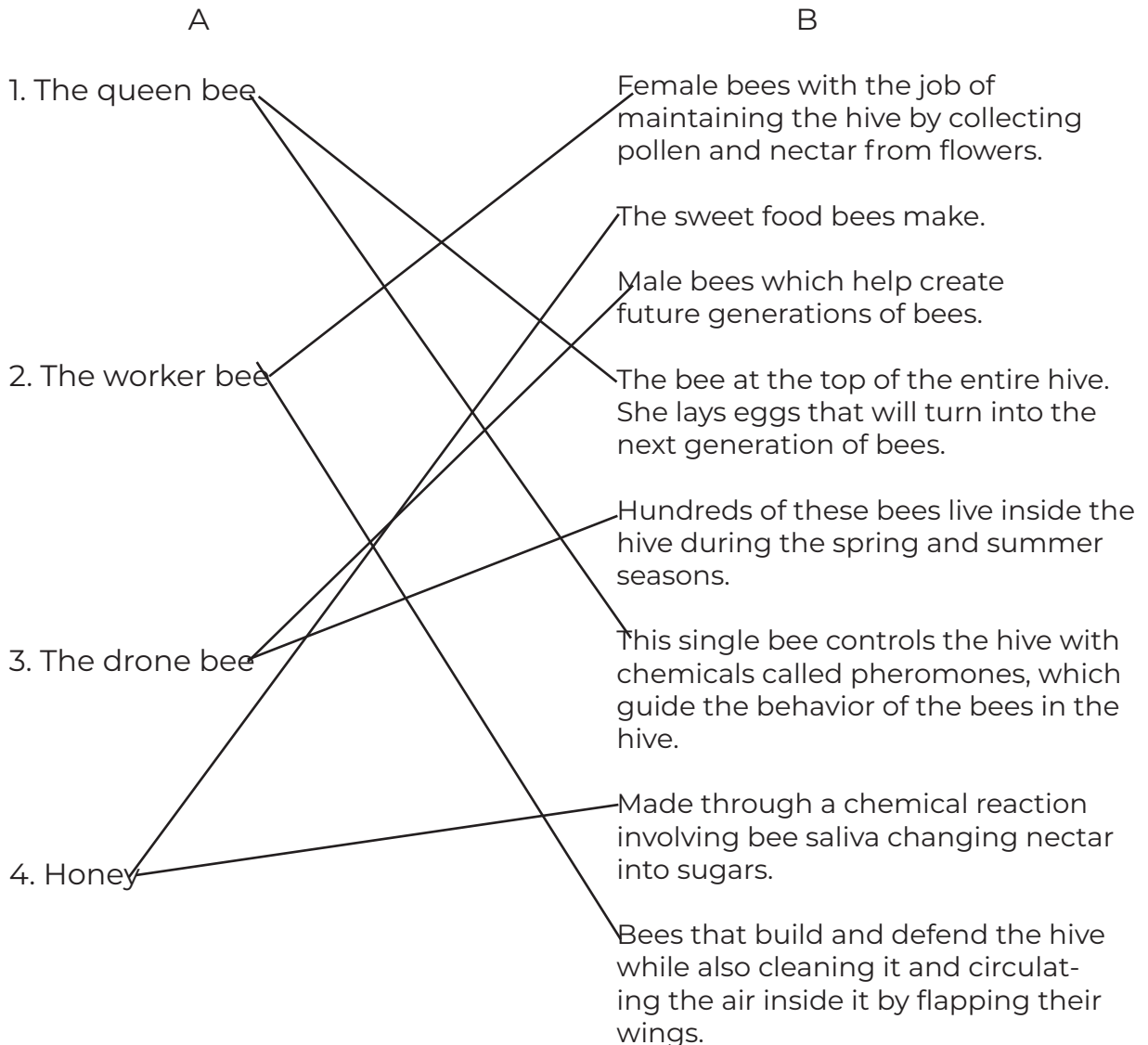
