

- 1. Brazil nuts tree primarily produce <u>fruit</u> only in the untouched <u>forests</u> in South America.
- 2. Brazil nut is the name of one of the largest and <u>oldest</u> trees in the Amazon rainforest
- 3. Brazil nut is also the <u>names</u> of the tree's commercially harvested edible <u>seeds</u>.
- 4. The fruit of a Brazil nut as a <u>seed</u> weighs up to 4.4 pounds, as heavy as a large <u>pineapple</u>.
- 5. Brazil nut trees are popular in <u>South America</u> because its wood is used for <u>flooring</u> and building.
- 6. Interestingly, even though these nuts are named <u>Brazil</u> <u>nuts</u>, they can be found in many countries in South America. The Brazil nut tree can be found in Guianas, Venezuela, eastern <u>Columbia</u>, eastern Peru and eastern Boliva alongside Brazil.
- 7. The trees are also enormous, reaching a height as tall as a state fair <u>Ferris wheel</u>, around 164 feet tall. Alongside being this tall, they <u>live</u> for a very long time. Brazil nut trees can reach an age between 500-1000 years old.
- 8. Brazil nuts are only found in South America because the trees need special pollinators, <u>orchid bees</u>, which pollinate their flowers.
- 9. Because these trees need specific bees for reproduction, it is against the law to cut one down without government <u>permission</u>.
- 10. The flowers, after being pollinated, require about <u>14 months</u> for the Brazil nut to grow.
